ORDER SCHEDULING ON-CALL CIVIL JURY TRIALS
February 7, 2022 through February 18, 2022

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the attached list of civil cases be added as on-call to the Fayette Jury Trial weeks scheduled for February 7, 2022 through February 18, 2022 in Fayette County Superior Court, Courtroom 2A, Fayetteville, Georgia.

IT IS ORDERED that this civil jury trial calendar is an on-call calendar to be heard after criminal jury trials are concluded. This will be a twenty-four hour on-call notice. Attorneys are to provide the Fayette Clerk and the Judge's office with their e-mails and contact phone numbers to be contacted for court appearance during the weeks of February 7th through February 18, 2022.

IT IS ORDERED that attorneys are to exchange and pre-mark exhibits, exhibit lists and witness lists, and to provide an original and two paper copies of any exhibits, exhibit lists, and witness lists to the Judge's office and the Court Reporter. This is to be provided no later than four business days before the start of the February 7th trial week. Any documents/exhibits not presented and marked ahead of any hearing will be deemed inadmissible. Attorneys should be familiar with the Court's electronic document projector (ELMO). There should be no need to exchange documents in Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the interest of public safety, every person entering the Fayette Courthouse shall be required to wear a face mask or covering and keep it on at all times in the Courtroom and Courthouse, unless allowed otherwise by the Court. Any parties testifying at the witness stand will be directed by the Judge for removal of face mask for testimony. All counsel and parties are ordered to utilize hand sanitizer and always maintain at least six (6) feet of social distance between individuals. Any witnesses waiting to testify will wait in a designated area by the Court, social distanced from any other person, until called in to testify.
