The listed cases in Table A, below, are hereby scheduled for civil jury trial or civil bench trials on the one-week trial calendar beginning on July 20, 2026, at 8:30 AM. The Pre-Trial Conference Hearing shall be held in person on June 15, 2026, at 8:30 AM in Courtroom 2D. The parties in the jury trial matters shall be excused from appearing at the Pre-Trial Conference if a consolidated pre-trial order is filed unless motions are pending in the case. All parties with bench trial matters are required to attend the Pre-Trial Conference in person.

For all cases ready to proceed to trial, motions in limine are to be filed with the Court on or before July 15, 2026, at 5:00 PM. All motions in limine are to be particularized and specifically state the evidence to be excluded or included.

Continuance requests shall not be considered unless submitted in writing. Unless special circumstances exist, all continuance requests and conflict notices shall be filed with the Court no later than one week prior to the trial calendar. In the event of settlement, parties shall be excused from appearing if they notify the Court in writing that the case has settled. In addition to submitting their requested jury charges in writing, all parties shall submit the charges in electronic format, via email to kespy@fayettecountyga.gov, on or before May 6, 2026, at 5:00 PM.

If any party desires to use the Court's audio/visual equipment and would like to schedule a time to test the equipment or have a tutorial on how to use the equipment, you must contact the Court's Staff Attorney, Kelly Espy, at least two days prior to the commencement of trial.

Please note that when a case is called in for trial, all parties are to have their evidence prepared and marked and witnesses present ready to proceed. There will be no delays once a jury trial begins.
